Education is an instrument which imparts knowledge and therefore controls power. As such, ever since the dawn of civilization persons in power have always tried to supervise or control education. It has been the handmaid of ruling class. During the Christian Era the ecclesiastics controlled the institution of education and diffused among the people the Gospel of the Bible and religious teachings. These Gospels were no other than a philosophy for the maintenance of the existing society. It taught the poor men to be meek and to earn their bread with the sweat of their brow, while the priests and the landlords lived in luxury, fought duels for the slightest offense. During the Renaissance, education passed more from the clutches of the priests into the hands of the prince. In other words, its became more secular. It was also due to the growth of the nation, state and powerful monarchs who united the country under their rule. Thus, under the control of the monarch, education began to devise and preach the infallibility of its master, the monarch or king. It also invented and supported fantastic theories like the Divine Right Theory and that the king can do no wrong.

With the advent of the Industrial Revolution, education took a different turn and had to please the new masters. It now no longer remained the privilege of the baron class but was thrown open to the new rich merchant class of society. Yet education was still confined to the few elite. The philosophy which was in vogue during this period was that of 'Laissez Faire' restricting the function of the state to the mere keeping of law and order while, on the other hand, in practice the law of the jingle prevailed in the form of free competition and survival of the fittest.




